

Our Epic 'playground' is now available

To enable you to practice what you've learnt in the classroom training a 'playground' has been created.

The playground allows us to play (or practice) in a safe environment where it doesn't matter if we make mistakes (as it doesn't contain real patient information and it will frequently be reset). The playground is available from any of the new eHospital (HP) computers. If the computer you normally use hasn't been changed yet remember you can use any of the new machines (even the workstations on wheels or wall mounted PCs). You'll also need the log in details given to you at training. playground?

Whilst the configuration of our electronic patient record is the result of a comprehensive process involving many hundreds of hundreds of hospital staff (secondees in the eHospital team and subject matter experts in the hospitals), for some of you, your training will be the first time you've seen anything more in depth that a presentation of showcase. When you are in training we would ask you to consider how each aspect you learn about fits with your service and if any further changes to service configuration would be beneficial. Feedback forms are available in class so you can note these thoughts as they occur. In this way we'll be making the most of our largest ever investment in improving healthcare quality.

Accessing the eLearnings

You can access the eLearnings you require prior to your classroom training from either an old Trust computer or from one of the new eHospital PCs. <u>See</u> web site for more information.

eLearnings show the standard Epic software without the CUH configuration. Also some of the processes that are described, particularly drug administration, differ from our practice. What you will see and be taught in class will be the software set up and the processes that we will be using here at CUH from 25 October and may differ from the eLearning.



So how does our existing patient information get into eHospital?

First let's start talking the same language - some definitions

1. Conversions

The automatic and manual importing of historical patient information currently held in our existing systems, to be conducted in the weeks and days prior to go live.

2. Cutover

The manual input of data regarding patients who

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will be inpatients at the time of go live. This will take place in the final days and hours immediately leading up to go live.

3. Personal demographics service

The Personal Demographics Services (PDS) is the national database that holds patient demographics data for the NHS and is the national authoritative source of patient demographics data (name, address, date of birth, NHS no., GP etc.) for the whole of the NHS. eHospital will see us connected to this national service for the first time.

Conversions

As shown in the diagram above, a number of activities will be undertaken as we approach 25 October to ensure that we get essential information from our existing systems to populate eHospital. Whilst some information will be imported into our Epic system, most will be held in a new database called LARDR (which stands for: linked accessible records and data repository) that we can access separately and from within Epic.

Over the weekend of 11-12 October we will be manually converting into Epic a significant amount of data from HISS and other administrative systems. We will be looking for administrative and clerical staff to help with this. Between the 13 and 24 October we will also be seeking help from admin and clerical and certain groups of clinical staff to complete the manual conversions. Your manager will approach you about this if we need your help.

Cutover

Starting on the Thursday before go live we'll be manually inputting essential patient data into Epic. Again we'll be looking for staff to assist in this process.

Paper clinical notes

Existing paper notes will be available for all outpatient follow up appointments and all inpatient encounters until November 2015. After this time, paper notes can be requested as required up until the expiration of the period specified in our data retention policy (which varies by condition/patient type). 10:30 - 11:30 Pre-live Super User and Managers briefing (option 2 choose one)

Since the last edition of eHospital Times over 1,000 new HP computers have been installed.



There are now three and a half thousand new computers in place in our clinical areas and counting...
