### Direct admissions

There appears to have been some misunderstanding around the admission of new patients out of hours.

The current practice for out of hours admissions is for the nurses on the wards to register a new patient, notify bed planning and admit the patient when they arrive - this will continue when eHospital goes live.

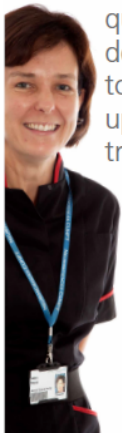

A first for Epic - they can supply in the UK and a first for CUH - we have the world's best electronic patient record and are connected to the NHS personal demographics service (aka the spine).

Over the weekend we switched from receiving Choose and Book referrals in to our old patient administration system and are now receiving them into Epic.

And all that is truly epic!

The playground is a copy of the database used for your training so will be familiar to you. You'll need the generic log in information you used in class to gain access into Epic Hyperspace.

Of course, when you come to use eHospital for real from 25 October (or before if you are helping to 'cutover' patient information) you'll have your own personal log in which will enable an audit trail of clinical activity and enable you to 'sign' orders etc.

The playground is available from any of the new eHospital (HP) computers or any old computer that has been prepared for eHospital. If the computer you normally use hasn't been changed/prepared yet, remember you can use any of the new machines (even the workstations on wheels or wall mounted PCs).

## 5,000 people have now set up their log-ins to access private content on my-eHospital.org - have you?

If you haven't logged in to my-eHospital.org please do so using one of the 'one time' log in emails you've been sent. A further email is being sent today to all those who haven't yet logged in. ***Please follow the instructions in the email as soon as you receive it.***

Creating your log on to this site will enable you to access an increasing library of information about eHospital that we are not able to display publicly for privacy or copyright reasons. It will also give you access to eLearning videos, tip sheets and updates over go-live. Note: This log in isn't for access to Epic, the Playground or the Training booking system.

***This process is much easier if undertaken straight away as the ability to do this will expire two weeks after you receive the email - so please don't put it off.***
